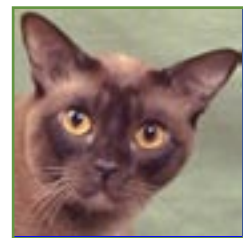

## OUR JUDGES



### ■ Ann Skilling (NZCF)

Animals have been part of Ann's life since early childhood. In the 1960's she began breeding Seal Burmese which led her to import and breed New Zealand's first Red, Cream and Chocolate Burmese. Through the years, Ann has been very active in the Cat Fancy, joining the Judges panel in 1975, becoming a Shorthair Tutor Judge. In the early years of the New Zealand Cat Fancy Ann was a National Executive member and was instrumental in presenting to the fledging NZCF its first show rules and breed standards. On her return from England in 2014 she was co-opted onto the History portfolio and reinstated to the All-Breeds judging panel



### ■ Penny Bydlinski (FiFe & FCCQ)

Penny Bydlinski was brought up in the United Kingdom with cats of one sort or another but bought her first Burmese in Canada in the 1960s. She bred Burmese under her prefix of Penric from 1969 to 2007. She has also bred Persians and, together with her partner Roger, Abyssinians under the prefix Rydene. Although Burmese will always be her first love, Abyssinians run a close second; it is a breed about which she feels very strongly.

She qualified as a FiFe judge for shorthairs in 1981 and later for both the Longhair and Semi-longhair categories. She was on the FiFe board from 1993 until her retirement in 2005, having been General Secretary for 10 years. Penny has judged extensively all over Europe, South America, Indonesia and Malaysia, as well as in Australia and New Zealand.

She was Chair of the first FiFe member in the UK and actively involved in its successor, serving on both the Show and the Judges Commission as well as being Chair, until her retirement in 1975, of the Garden of England Cat Club that she founded in 1991

She is the current Honorary Secretary of the Feline Control Council of Queensland Inc. Penny is now semi-retired and living high in the hinterland of the Gold Coast in Queensland.

She is still Secretary of the World Cat Congress, a post she has occupied since 1995 and which she enjoys very much as it gives an opportunity for meeting and exchanging ideas with people from other organisations around the world.

She now has more time to enjoy her hobbies of books, embroidery, theatre and gardening in the very beautiful surroundings where she lives with the company of her three cats, a black Exotic neuter, a brown Burmese neuter and, of course, an Abby neuter.

In 2011, FCCQ invited Penny to become its first Honorary Judge and the Council was delighted when she accepted. Penny was presented with her FCCQ Honorary Judge badge at the October 2011 show and will be invited to judge on a regular basis.



### ■ Nikki James (NSWCFA)

I come from a family of cat lover's and therefore have always had a cat to curl up on my lap since my childhood. I developed a love for the elegant and talkative Siamese as a teenager, and when I was 15 acquired my first Red Point male, Conan, in 1990. I showed him as a member of the RAS Cat Control for 2 years and he sired a few litters with my mother's Seal Point female under her prefix 'Eronel'. I returned to the cat fancy in 2005 showing a beautiful Blue Point female as a member of the NSWCFA. I started my breeding journey with her in late 2005 when she had a wonderful litter of 6 kittens from an Oriental stud under my prefix 'Zoe'. I still have a neuter boy, Zeus, from that first litter who enjoyed many years on the show bench. My late mother also enjoyed participating in the cat fancy as a member of the NSWCFA and accompanied me to most shows, initially showing a black Oriental neuter, Romeo; he was also born in my first litter, and later exhibiting some other beautiful show neuters she spoilt over the years. I am proud to have achieved many Top 5 cat of the year awards and have had the honour of breeding a Supreme Exhibit.

I continue to breed Siamese and Orientals and remain active in the cat fancy as an exhibitor and worker. I qualified as a steward in 2007. I have a small cattery and breed my kittens for health,

temperament and show quality. Currently my cat family consists of 5 felines.

I have been a member of the Oriental Cat Club of NSW for many years, previously assisting as show manager and serving on the board as club treasurer, a position I still hold.

I attained my probationary shorthaired Judge's license in 2015. I consider myself privileged to admire, handle and judge the show exhibits and I have developed an appreciation of the diversity of exhibits in Group 3.

In my normal life I am a mother to 5 children, with 3 boys still living at home ranging in ages from 17 to 5 years who keep me busy and our cats entertained. I am halfway through studying for a Bachelor degree in Midwifery at UTS. Living and growing up on the Northern Beaches I usually spend most of the summer as a beach bum, reading a good book, when not attending cat shows!



■ **Rhondda Watson**  
(NSWCFA)

I am an All Breeds Tutor Judge and have helped with the training of many NSW and interstate Judges. I have judged throughout Australia and New Zealand where I have made many friends throughout the Cat Fancy. I enjoy my judging assignments and consider it a great privilege to be invited to judge and handle so many beautiful felines and such a variety of breeds in Australia & overseas.

I was President of the Siamese Cat Society for many years, resigning from that position in 1996 to become President of the Siamese & Shorthair Cat Club. Other Clubs I support are the Abyssinian Cat Club, the Burmese Cat Club, the Oriental Cat Club and the Bengal Breed Club.

I have been a registered breeder since 1975. In 1984 I was elected to the Consultative Committee of RAS Cat Control and have served on that Committee and its successor, the NSWCFA Management Committee, continuously until the present time. During these years of service I have been involved with fund-raising & was responsible for organizing Cat of the Year Luncheons and Champion of

Champion dinners for many years. I have also been involved in training classes for Shorthair Judges, Domestic Judges and Stewards. I have been a delegate for CCCA meetings and have worked on the Breed Standards Committee and the Judges Training Committee. My goal is to see a United Australian Cat Fancy where all the controls work together to promote the breeding and showing of our pedigreed cats.



■ **Valerie Hurry** (NSWCFA)

I joined the NSW CFA in 1966 as a breeder and exhibitor of Siamese under the prefix Alkira (NSW). Over the years I have diversified and have included

Tabby Points, Orientals, Abyssinians, British Shorthair and Cornish Rex in my breeding programs.

I gained my Shorthair Judges Licence in 1978 and qualified as an All Breeds judge in 1995. I have judged in most States of Australia and in New Zealand.

I served as a member of the Management committee of the NSW CFA for 6 years before retiring. I am the current Treasurer of Illawarra Pedigree Cat Fancy Inc. and a life member of that club. I am also an active member of several other affiliates and when not judging, I enjoy exhibiting and assisting at shows in any capacity.



■ **Chris Buckley**  
(NSWCFA)

I am a tutor steward and became a companion Judge in 2003. I am a long standing member of the Burmese Cat Society, holding the position

of Secretary for some years and currently am Show Manager. In my professional career I work with animals and feel that I have a great understanding with many aspects of animal ethics and welfare and believe I offer a valuable resource to the Cat Fancy.

I began showing in 1989 with a Burmese Chocolate spay, Rosepark Choc A Chip, and have been a cat owner for as long as I can remember, usually companions before I got involved with Burmese. I love all animals, however cats are my favourite and I believe that

most cats tend to be aware of those people that are confident with them and act accordingly. I enjoy all my judging and stewarding assignments and look forward to handling these beautiful companions exhibits as much as possible as no real standard means you judge each cat on its merits, not its pedigree.



■ **Garry Stephens (NSWCFA)**

I have been a Companion cat judge since 2000 and really enjoy judging this group.

In 1983 I began showing two Burmese cats originally purchased as pets and in that year one of them

Amaryllis Meggie won RAS Shorthair Spay Cat of the Year. So started my involvement in cat showing and breeding, and a little later show management and club administration. While I have specialized in Burmese and more recently in Maine Coons my experience as a steward since 1986 has given me a good appreciation of all breeds.

I firmly believe that good health and temperament are essential to making a good pet as well as a good show cat. This was my prime motivation in becoming a Companion cat judge where cleanliness, condition, appearance, and temperament are the key judging criteria

## NSW C.F.A. Inc. Members & Associate Members Cat/Kitten of the Year Awards

A cat/kitten may accumulate points for a Members or Associate Members Cat/Kitten of the Year Award only whilst it is in the ownership\* of a financial member of The NSW Cat Fanciers' Association Inc.

Note that:

(i) should an owner become a member of the Association after the commencement of the calendar year, ie after 1st January, a cat/kitten owned by the new member will be eligible for the awards **but points will accumulate only from the date that the membership application is processed by the Association's office.**

(ii) if during the year ownership of a cat/kitten is transferred from a financial member to a new owner who is not a member, the cat/kitten's ownership by a financial member will be deemed to be continuous provided a membership application from the new owner is received by the Association's office within 4 weeks of the transfer as recorded by the NSW C.F.A.

**\* joint owners must each be financial members of the Association**

You may elect to not enter an exhibit in one or more of the rings. Please mark this on your entry form for the exhibit concerned. Note that there will be no reduction in fee for the exhibit if you do this.

Coloured or white cage curtains may be used.

"own cages" may be used - **if you are to use an "own cage" for an exhibit PLEASE indicate the relevant size on the entry form (see the list on the entry form).**

Litter kittens, entered in the age classes, will be judged from the litter cage, so you will not need to provide separate curtains.

### Kittens/Litters Cage Areas

Both exhibitors and the public will not be permitted to enter the kittens/litters cage areas whilst any kitten judging is taking place.  
**this requirement will be strictly enforced.**





### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- An official NSW C.F.A. entry form must be completed and forwarded.
- For each exhibit entered a legible copy of the exhibit's 4 generation pedigree, as issued by a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF, or by ANCATS, must be attached.
- The summary sheet** which accompanies this schedule must be completed and forwarded also.
- An exhibitor resident in NSW must be a current financial member of a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF, or by ANCATS. However
  - A new exhibitor resident in NSW may show 3 times as a non-member provided any exhibit(s) shown is/are registered in the exhibitor's name with NSW C.F.A. Inc.
  - An exhibitor resident in another state/territory/country must be a member of a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF in that state/territory/country, or by ANCATS, and the exhibit(s) entered registered in the exhibitor's name with that controlling body.
- All exhibits must conform to CCCA Breed Standards. Breeds & colours not included in the CCCA Breed Standards are not eligible to be entered.
- Any amendment to the title, sex, and/or colour classification of an exhibit after entry has been lodged **MUST** be submitted in writing, **accompanied by a copy of the amended Certificate of Registration**, to the Show Secretary **not later than 1 week prior to the show date**, unless prior arrangement has been made with the Show Secretary to provide the changes at a later date. **No changes will be made to the catalogue or judging slips on the day of the show.**
- Vaccination Requirements:**  
**Each kitten exhibit** must have had at least one Feline-3 vaccination not less than 14 days prior to the Show. The first Feline 3 vaccination must have been administered by a qualified veterinary practitioner.  
An exhibitor must produce to the Veterinary Officer **documentary proof of vaccination (valid vaccination certificate)** for all kitten exhibits owned by the exhibitor. A photocopy is acceptable providing it identifies the kitten in question and is a copy of the complete certificate. Failure to do so by a NSWCFCA member exhibitor may result in rejection of the exhibit(s) for that show, and if not rejected the exhibitor is required to email a copy of the certificate to the NSWCFCA office within 2 working days of the show. Failure by a non NSWCFCA member to provide a valid vaccination certificate will result in the rejection of the exhibits.
- All exhibits must have their front & back claws clipped
- ONLY OZ-PET OR PAPER LITTER MAY BE USED**
- All cats/kittens must remain on exhibition in show cages until 4.00 p.m. unless permission to leave early has been granted by the Show Manager prior to the show.**
- The Show Secretary reserves the right to transfer exhibits which are incorrectly entered.
- Returned Cheques: Should a cheque you forward in payment be returned unpaid you will be contacted and required (a) to make an immediate Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) to the Society's account and (b) to inform the Show Secretary a.s.a.p. after this has been done. Once the Secretary has checked that the payment has been credited to the Society's account your entry will be confirmed.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the venue.
- Cancellations** We ask for your co-operation in notifying the Show Secretary of cancellations before 12.00 noon Friday 17th March (where possible).
- Exhibitors are reminded:**  
A Judge or Steward does not have to handle any exhibit showing signs of aggression. Owners have a duty of care not to bench exhibits with a reported history of fractious behaviour. Show Managers and the Show Committee, in consultation with the Show Representative, have the right to require the removal of the latter exhibits from the Show.

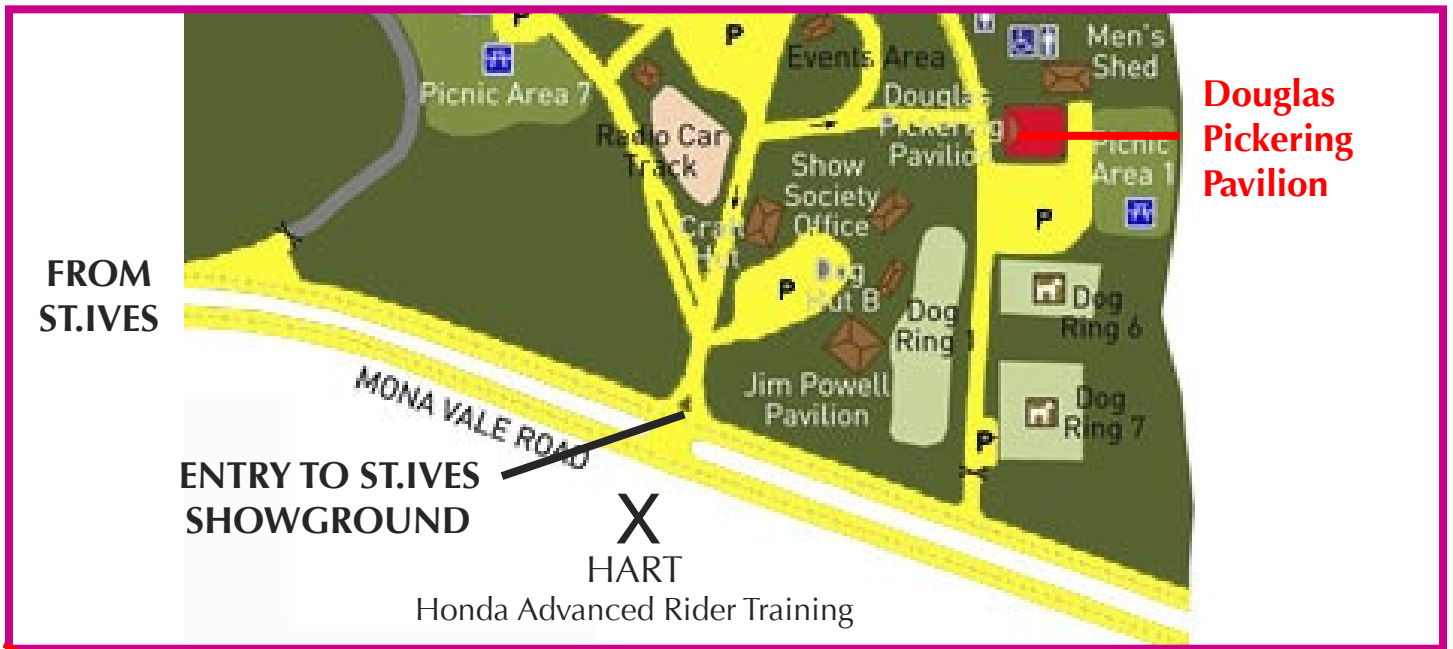

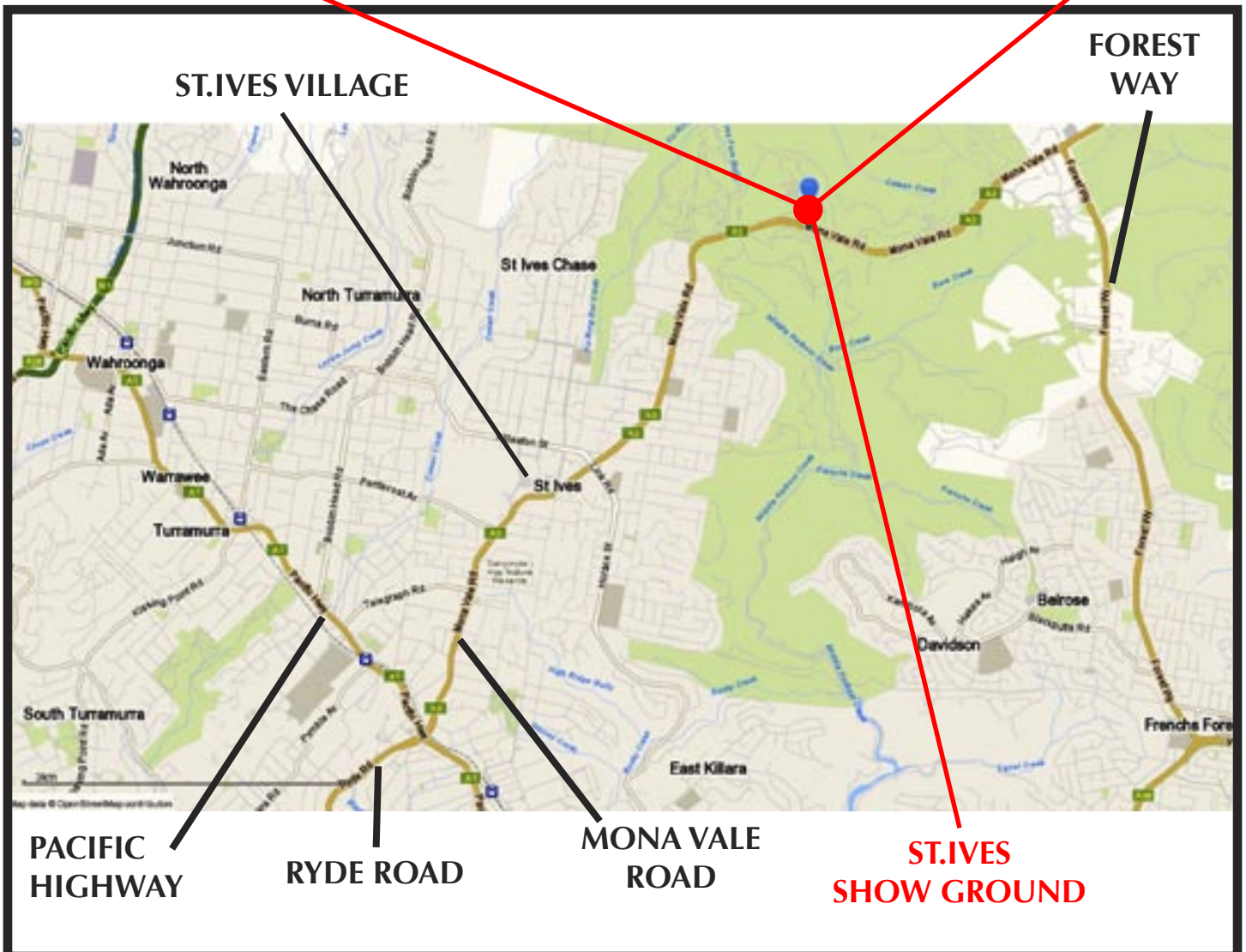
