## OUR JUDGES



### ■ Peter Williams (GCCF)

owned and involved with Burmese for over 25 years being my first breed and passion. Recently seen the influence of non UK bred Burmese with the lifting of the importation ban into the UK, now tests are available to safeguard the breed from genetic defects. This has also lead to subtle and not so subtle changes in the breed type and colour over the past 10 years. I now own Cornish rex which again I have been involved with for 25 year and breed cinnamon, fawn and red series with or without tabby. Keen gardener, travel extensively with work, previously lived in Australia for 3 years and delighted to be invited back to the Burmese Show and have the opportunity to meet exhibitors and breeders and have the privilege of handling your cats.



### ■ Margaret Sim (NSWCFA)

I have always had cats, firstly moggies then my father bred Seal Point Siamese. I met a pair of Burmese in the early 1970's and fell in total love with them, specially the Blue Burmese. When I settled down in Sydney I went in search of a Blue Burmese and ended up with a Lilac and Chocolate – they converted my partner Don to cats and in particular Burmese. He in turn converted me to Labrador Retrievers. We moved out of the city to Moss Vale – we had space and time so I commenced breeding and showing in 1987 under the prefix Bima. I breed all colours of Burmese and love them all – my favourites are blue, red and blue tortie.

This led to stewarding which gave me a love of many other breeds and in 1994 I commenced a judging course. I completed Group 2 in 1996, Group 3 in 1998 and in 2009 completed Group 1. I have judged in most states of Australia as well as in New Zealand. I have been involved in clubs – club secretary, committee member and am currently President of the Burmese Cat Society of Australasia. I have experience as show manager as well as working in card rooms and trophies, also lots of experience setting up and pulling down shows.

In my other life I am a registered nurse and midwife and currently work in a neonatal nursery. I have experience in management, aged care, education, women's health, aboriginâal health, community health and paediatrics. My other interests are gardening, patchwork and quilting.

### ■ Valerie Cashman (NSWCFA)

Allbreeds judge and retired breeder of Burmese under the prefix of "Aurora" with success on the show scene in Australia, Europe, Poland, Russia, South Africa, Canada, USA and New Zealand. My love of Burmese started about 33 years ago with a rescue cat in Sydney.

I have held numerous positions of office within the cat fancy in Queensland, including Registrar and Secretarial duties during which time I set up a large database using Fife EMS codes for one council. I was President of The Burmese Cat Society of Qld (a QFA affiliated club) for many years.



I am interested in cat welfare, and was a committee member in 2009 for fundraising for Native Wildlife injured and displaced by Australias worst bushfires.

I enjoy Judging and was privileged to be judging at the ACF National in Hobart 2007, and in five Australian states, the Northern Territory and for several Clubs in NZ. I was a member of The Gold Coast Cat Club for 19 years and was Secretary for that club for a while.



### ■ Sue Thomas (NSWCFA)

From early childhood I have had a lifelong association with various domestic cats and also a Manx. My husband and I purchased our first Burmese in 1983. In 1985 we began showing, after purchasing two further neuter boys, both of whom were absolute family favourites with their wonderful temperaments. Further kittens were bought in 1999, and later and so continued the showing. I had made up my mind around this time that I would like to breed these gorgeous cats, however, this did not occur until 2006 when I purchased my first two breeding girls, and began breeding under the Sukimah prefix with some success on the show bench.

Stewarding followed, which I found to be a most rewarding experience, and one which enhanced my appreciation of other breeds. This in turn led me to studying for an all shorthair judge's license, which I now hold.

For some years now I have been and am the current secretary of The Burmese Cat Society of A'sia, and previously I was the treasurer for quite a few years. For a period of time I was also the minute secretary of the Newcastle & Hunter Valley Cat Club Inc. I am a current member of the NSW CFA Inc Managemant Committee, and I am a member of both the Compliance/Education and Judges' Sub Committees.

In my private life I work as the fulltime practice manager of an accountancy practice. Among some of my interests outside of breeding and showing cats, are car hillclimbing, reading, gardening, my family and simply spending time with our beautiful cats.

### ■ Chris Buckley (NSWCFA)

I am a tutor steward and became a companion Judge in 2003. I am a long standing member of the Burmese Cat Society, holding the position of Secretary for some years and currently am Show Manager. In my professional career I work with animals and feel that



I have a great understanding with many aspects of animal ethics and welfare and believe I offer a valuable resource to the Cat Fancy.

I began showing in 1989 with a Burmese Chocolate spay, Rosepark Choc A Chip, and have been a cat owner for as long as I can remember, usually companions before I got involved with Burmese. I love all animals, however cats are my favourite and I believe that most cats tend to be aware of those people that are confident with them and act accordingly. I enjoy all my judging and stewarding assignments and look forward to handling these beautiful companions exhibits as much as possible as no real standard means you judge each cat on its merits, not its pedigree.

### ■ Garry Stephens (NSWCFA)

I have been a Companion cat judge since 2000 and really enjoy judging this group.

In 1983 I began showing two Burmese cats originally purchased as pets and in that year one of them Amaryllis

Meggie won RAS Shorthair Spay Cat of the Year. So started my involvement in cat showing and breeding, and a little

later show management and club administration. While I have specialized in Burmese and more recently in Maine Coons my experience as a steward since 1986 has given me a good appreciation of all breeds.

I firmly believe that good health and temperament are essential to making a good pet as well as a good show cat. This was my prime motivation in becoming a Companion cat judge where cleanliness, condition, appearance, and temperament are the key judging criteria

## NSW C.F.A. Inc. Members & Associate Members Cat/Kitten of the Year Awards

A cat/kitten may accumulate points for a Members or Associate Members Cat/Kitten of the Year Award only whilst it is in the ownership\* of a financial member of The NSW Cat Fanciers' Association Inc.

Note that:

(i) should an owner become a member of the Association after the commencement of the calendar year, ie after 1st January, a cat/kitten owned by the new member will be eligible for the awards **but points will accumulate only from the date that the membership application is processed by the Association's office.**

(ii) if during the year ownership of a cat/kitten is transferred from a financial member to a new owner who is not a member, the cat/kitten's ownership by a financial member will be deemed to be continuous provided a membership application from the new owner is received by the Association's office within 4 weeks of the transfer as recorded by the NSW C.F.A.

**\* joint owners must each be financial members of the Association**

You may elect to not enter an exhibit in one or more of the rings. Please mark this on your entry form for the exhibit concerned. Note that there will be no reduction in fee for the exhibit if you do this.

Coloured or white cage curtains may be used.

"own cages" may be used - **if you are to use an "own cage" for an exhibit PLEASE indicate the relevant size on the entry form (see the list on the entry form).**

Litter kittens, entered in the age classes, will be judged from the litter cage, so you will not need to provide separate curtains.

### Kittens/Litters Cage Areas

Both exhibitors and the public will not be permitted to enter the kittens/litters cage areas whilst any kitten judging is taking place.  
**this requirement will be strictly enforced.**



### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- An official NSW C.F.A. entry form must be completed and forwarded.
- For each exhibit entered a legible copy of the exhibit's 4 generation pedigree, as issued by a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF, or by ANCATS, must be attached.
- The summary sheet** which accompanies this schedule must be completed and forwarded also.
- An exhibitor resident in NSW must be a current financial member of a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF, or by ANCATS. However
  - A new exhibitor resident in NSW may show 3 times as a non-member provided any exhibit(s) shown is/are registered in the exhibitor's name with NSW C.F.A. Inc.
  - An exhibitor resident in another state/territory/country must be a member of a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF in that state/territory/country, or by ANCATS, and the exhibit(s) entered registered in the exhibitor's name with that controlling body.
- All exhibits must conform to CCCA Breed Standards. Breeds & colours not included in the CCCA Breed Standards are not eligible to be entered.
- Any amendment to the title, sex, and/or colour classification of an exhibit after entry has been lodged **MUST** be submitted in writing, **accompanied by a copy of the amended Certificate of Registration**, to the Show Secretary **not later than 1 week prior to the show date**, unless prior arrangement has been made with the Show Secretary to provide the changes at a later date.

**No changes will be made to the catalogue or judging slips on the day of the show.**

#### **Veterinary Inspection:**

Each exhibit must be inspected by and pass the veterinary officer's inspection before being allowed to be benched in the show. Exhibitors are to handle their own exhibits at the veterinary inspection table.

**Each kitten exhibit** must have had at least one Feline-3 vaccination not less than 14 days prior to the Show. One Feline 3 vaccination must have been administered by a qualified veterinary practitioner.

An exhibitor must produce to the Veterinary Officer **documentary proof of vaccination (valid vaccination certificate)** for all kitten exhibits owned by the exhibitor. A photocopy is acceptable providing it identifies the kitten in question and is a copy of the complete certificate. Failure to do so by a NSWCFCA member exhibitor may result in rejection of the exhibit(s) for that show, and if not rejected the exhibitor is required to email a copy of the certificate to the NSWCFCA office within 2 working days of the show. Failure by a non NSWCFCA member to provide a valid vaccination certificate will result in the rejection of the exhibits.

- All exhibits must have their front & back claws clipped
- ONLY OZ-PET OR PAPER LITTER MAY BE USED**
- All cats/kittens must remain on exhibition in show cages until 4.00 p.m. unless permission to leave early has been granted by the Show Manager prior to the show.**
- The Show Secretary reserves the right to transfer exhibits which are incorrectly entered.
- Returned Cheques: Should a cheque you forward in payment be returned unpaid you will be contacted and required (a) to make an immediate Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) to the Society's account and (b) to inform the Show Secretary a.s.a.p. after this has been done. Once the Secretary has checked that the payment has been credited to the Society's account your entry will be confirmed.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the venue.

**Cancellations** We ask for your co-operation in notifying the Show Secretary of cancellations before 12.00 noon Friday 17th March (where possible).

#### **Exhibitors are reminded:**

A Judge or Steward does not have to handle any exhibit showing signs of aggression. Owners have a duty of care not to bench exhibits with a reported history of fractious behaviour. Show Managers and the Show Committee, in consultation with the Show Representative, have the right to require the removal of the latter exhibits from the Show.


