NOTE: Companion Exhibits

A **Companion Kitten/Cat** is one which is of unknown ancestry, a mixed breed, part pedigreed or a pure breed which is not able to be registered in the usual group.

• A Kitten is one over 10 weeks of age & under 9 months of age.

• A Cat is one 9 months of age and over.

To be eligible for showing a companion cat must be desexed. A companion kitten over the age of 6 months must be desexed.

For the purposes of judging an Unregistered Companion Kitten/Cat will be classified on the basis of the information supplied on the unregistered companion exhibit entry form, as:

● A **Domestic** kitten/cat is one whose sire & dam are unknown, or are both not registered, or both are not registered pedigree cats, or a

● A **Household Pet** kitten/cat is one whose sire or dam but not both is registered, is a pedigree cat which is unregistrable, or is an unregistered pedigree cat, being part of a registered litter, which has been desexed and sold as Pet only.

A Domestic kitten/cat will be classified as to Coat:

● A **Patched** Coat is any coloured coat WITH white (ie, black & white, etc.)

● A **Patterned** Coat is any coat pattern WITHOUT white (ie: tabby or tortoiseshell, etc.)

● A **Solid** Coat is one colour

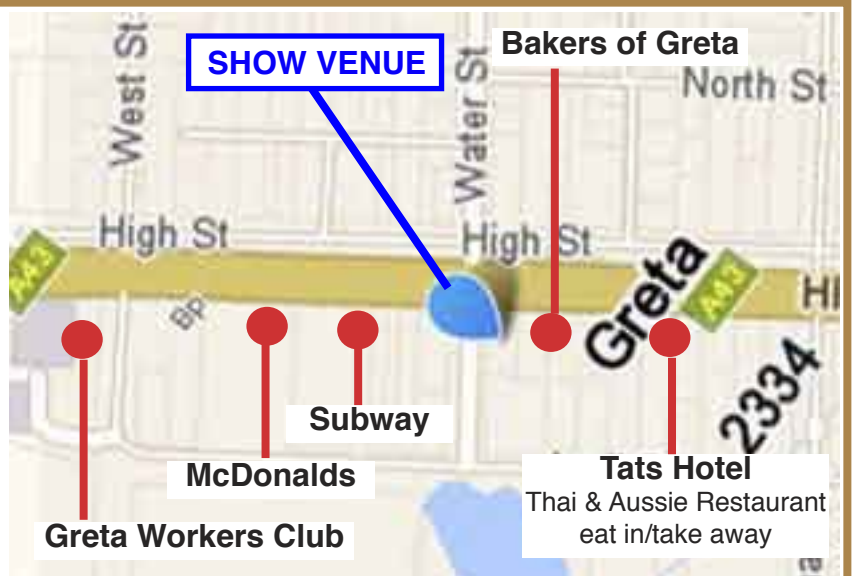

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- ❑ An official NSW C.F.A. entry form must be completed and forwarded.
- ❑ For each exhibit entered a legible copy of the exhibit's 4 generation pedigree, as issued by a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF, or by ANCATS, must be attached.
- ❑ **The summary sheet** which accompanies this schedule must be completed and forwarded also.
- ❑ An exhibitor resident in NSW must be a current financial member of a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF, or by ANCATS. However
 - A new exhibitor resident in NSW may show 3 times as a non-member provided any exhibit(s) shown is/are registered in the exhibitor's name with NSW C.F.A. Inc.
 - An exhibitor resident in another state/territory/country must be a member of a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF in that state/territory/country, or by ANCATS, and the exhibit(s) entered registered in the exhibitor's name with that controlling body.
- ❑ All exhibits must conform to CCCA Breed Standards. Breeds & colours not included in the CCCA Breed Standards are not eligible to be entered.
- ❑ Any amendment to the title, sex, and/or colour classification of an exhibit after entry has been lodged **MUST** be submitted in writing, accompanied by a copy of the amended Certificate of Registration, to the Show Entry Clerk not later than 1 week prior to the show date, unless prior arrangement has been made with the Entry Clerk to provide the changes at a later date. No changes will be made to the catalogue or judging slips on the day of the show.
- ❑ **Veterinary Inspection:**
Each exhibit must be inspected by and pass the veterinary officer's inspection before being allowed to be benched in the show. Exhibitors are to handle their own exhibits at the veterinary inspection table.
Each kitten exhibit must have had at least one Feline-3 vaccination not less than 14 days prior to the Show. One Feline 3 vaccination must have been administered by a qualified veterinary practitioner.
An exhibitor must produce to the Veterinary Officer **documentary proof of vaccination (valid vaccination certificate)** for all kitten exhibits owned by the exhibitor. A photocopy is acceptable providing it identifies the kitten in question and is a copy of the complete certificate. Failure to do so by a NSWCFCA member exhibitor may result in rejection of the exhibit(s) for that show, and if not rejected the exhibitor is required to email a copy of the certificate to the NSWCFCA office within 2 working days of the show. Failure by a non NSWCFCA member to provide a valid vaccination certificate will result in the rejection of the exhibits.

- ❑ **ONLY PAPER LITTER MAY BE USED**
- ❑ **All cats/kittens must remain on exhibition in show cages until 4.00 p.m.** unless permission to leave early has been granted by the Show Floor Manager prior to the show.
- ❑ The Show Entry Clerk reserves the right to transfer exhibits which are incorrectly entered.
- ❑ Returned Cheques: Should a cheque you forward in payment be returned unpaid you will be contacted and required (a) to make an immediate Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) to the Club's account and (b) to inform the Show Entry Clerk a.s.a.p. after this has been done. Once it has been checked that the payment has been credited to the Club's account your entry will be confirmed.
- ❑ Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the venue.
- ❑ **Cancellations** We ask for your co-operation in notifying the Show Secretary of cancellations before 12.00 noon on the Friday before the show (if possible)
- ❑ The use of Talcum Powder is strictly prohibited within the Venue.
- ❑ **Exhibitors are reminded:**
A Judge or Steward does not have to handle any exhibit showing signs of aggression. Owners have a duty of care not to bench exhibits with a reported history of fractious behaviour. Show Managers and the Show Committee, in consultation with the Show Representative, have the right to require the removal of the latter exhibits from the Show.
- ❑ Challenge/Award of Merit Cards will be completed by each judge after their judging in a bay is concluded. These and award cards will be placed on cages after all judging in a bay is concluded. All such cards and trophies placed on cages are the responsibility of the exhibitor and will not be replaced should they go missing.
- ❑ Best of Breed, Challenge and Best in Section ribbons will not be awarded



JUDGES' PROFILES

Rod U'ren (CFA)

Rod obtained his first pedigreed cat in 1963, imported his first two White Persians and became a member of the Feline Control Council of Victoria, Australia's second largest cat registry, in 1967 and has been breeding Persians since then under the Firnbank, Lavendel, Sublime and Preview prefixes, though his original prefix for the Whites was Firnbank. He has also bred Exotics, Scottish Folds and Singapuras in partnership with others.

His principal interest in the past has been lecturing in judges training courses, conferences and seminars, along with colour, genetics and the health of cats. He was the past Chair of the Breed Sub-Committee of his council of the time (the Feline Control Council of Victoria) and the immediate past FCCV Groups 1 and 2 Tutor judge. He was the FCCV Registrar for many years and is still CCCT registrar. He has also written widely on colour genetics over the years and has lectured frequently at judges conferences in Australia and in three continents overseas.

He was instrumental in developing and formatting the current CCCA national breed standards for judging in Australia and helped to develop the standard for new breeds in CCCA. Snowshoe and Peterbald are two most recent examples, along with updating the Bengal standard.

He began judging in 1978, becoming All Breeds in 1990, judging widely throughout Australia and overseas, especially in most parts of Asia. He enjoys the opportunity judging gives to interact with exhibitors.

After judging approximately 65 CFA shows as a guest judge since 2006, at the start of 2018, he applied and was accepted as a CFA judge in USA. This has changed his direction in the cat world, though he is still able to judge for other organizations, with CFA approval. He is looking forward to this new stage of his career.



I am currently serving as President of the Co-ordinating Cat Council of Australia (CCCA) plus Chairperson and holding various positions on many sub-committees relating to judging, breeding, showing and standards matters.

I am honored also to be currently serving as the Vice President of the World Cat Congress. It is a great privilege to represent the CCCA at this level and exchange ideas with such knowledgeable and enthusiastic delegates from all the major international Feline organisations.

Sue Thomas (NSWCFA)

From early childhood I have had a lifelong association with various domestic cats and also a Manx. My husband and I purchased our first Burmese in 1983. In 1985 we began showing, after purchasing two further neuter boys, both of whom were absolute family favourites with their wonderful temperaments. Further kittens were bought in 1999, and later and so continued the showing. I had made up my mind around this time that I would like to breed these gorgeous cats, however, this did not occur until 2006 when I purchased my first two breeding girls, and began breeding under the Sukimah prefix with some success on the show bench.

Stewarding followed, which I found to be a most rewarding experience, and one which enhanced my appreciation of other breeds. This in turn led me to studying for an all shorthair judge's license, which I now hold.

For some years now I have been and am the current secretary of The Burmese Cat Society of A'sia, and previously I was the treasurer for quite a few years. For a period of time I was also the minute secretary of the Newcastle & Hunter Valley Cat Club Inc. I am a current member of the NSW CFA Inc Management Committee, and I am a member of both the Compliance/Education and Judges' Sub Committees.

In my private life I work as the fulltime practice manager of an accountancy practice. Among some of my interests outside of breeding and showing cats, are car hillclimbing, reading, gardening, my family and simply spending time with our beautiful cats.



Cheryle U'ren (FCCV)

I have been a member of the CCCA Member Body the Feline Control Council of Victoria since it's inception in 1962. I was first licensed to judge in 1965.

Over the past 53 years I have gained broad experience with judging appointments throughout Australia and New Zealand plus USA, United Kingdom, Europe, Hong Kong, Singapore, Thailand, Brunei, Malaysia, South Africa, Indonesia, Japan, Taiwan and a great many parts of China thus gaining valuable knowledge into international variations of breeds of cats.

I am an FCCV and CCCofA National Tutor and Examining All Breeds judge and am involved in lecturing and conducting of Judges Seminars for both organisations.

Over the years I have shown my preference for breeding and showing with great success top quality Persians in Solid, Himalayan and Marked colours and more recently Singapuras.



Fiona Mangan (NSWCFA)

Animals have always been important in my life. After growing up with the company of whippets, greyhounds and a succession of cats of varying descriptions, I became interested in cats in a serious way after forming a liaison with my first Abyssinians, a tawny and a silver, in 1989. Initially, it was just an involvement in showing cats. Breeding them soon followed, specialising in Silver Abyssinians under the Nivalis prefix. Today, we have a multi-cat household, each of them allotted time according to their need to love and be loved. All cats are





special and each is unique, regardless of their ancestry. I am a member of several cat clubs and have, for many years, been actively involved with the Abyssinian Cat Club of Australasia serving in roles including President, Secretary, Treasurer and Show Manager. Since 1998 I have been active as a steward, enjoying assignments in all groups. In 2003, I qualified as a Companion Exhibit Judge.

My pedigreed judging experience began with Group 3 (full licence 2010), followed by Group 2 in 2013, attaining my Shorthair Judge's licence. In 2016, I was completed my Longhair licence (Group 1) and am now fully licenced as an All Breeds Judge.

Currently residing in the Hunter Valley Wine Country region of NSW, I enjoy observing and learning about our local wildlife. Apart from my strong interest in all things feline, other interests include zoology, reading, embroidery, quilting.

Deborah Cameron (NSWCFA)

I have been involved in the cat fancy for over 30 years being introduced to the cat fancy by my mother. I bred and showed Persians including silvers, pointed varieties and bi colours and of course like many others, devoted time working at cat shows. My house has the bounce of the shorthair Singapura and the beauty of the Persian; I have held a number of executive positions within the cat fancy and previously, served on the NSW CFA Management Committee. I am an All Breeds Judge and a Group 1 Tutor Judge. In my spare time I work full time in local government managing a large team of community workers and enjoy the company of my daughter, my cats and dog, Eddie.



Chris Buckley(NSWCFA)

I am a steward and became a companion Judge in 2003. I am also heavily involved in the Burmese Cat Society where I am the Secretary as well as the Show Manager. I am also involved with the Camden Show Society as a Committee member. In my professional career I also work with animals and feel that I have a great understanding with many aspects of animal ethics and welfare and



believe I offer a valuable resource to the Cat Fancy. I began showing in 1989 with a Burmese Chocolate spay, Rosepark Choc A Chip, who is still going well at nearly 20 years of age and have been a cat owner for as long as I can remember, usually companions before I got involved with Burmese. I love all animals, however cats are my favourite and I believe that most cats tend to be aware of those people that are confident with them and act accordingly. I enjoy all my judging and stewarding assignments and look forward to handling these beautiful companions exhibits as much as possible as no real standard means you judge each cat on its merits, not its pedigree.

Paul Fitzhenry (NSWCFA)

I have been involved in the cat fancy since 1971 and in that time I have successfully bred and shown Persian cats, and recently Siamese and Orientals, under the Perzeena prefix. I bred the 1985 Longhair RASCC Male Cat of the Year (Db Gd Ch & CCCA Ch Perzeena Drifts Son (orange eyed white Persian) and I have owned other Cats of the Year and numerous Top 5 award winners as well. I have also shown a British Shorthair and a Devon Rex with success on the show bench for both.



In 1995 I was invited to become a Companion Cat Judge. This is an honour which I take very seriously and which I greatly enjoy.

I am actively involved in several clubs, including Kempsey Kat Klub of which I am a Life Member. I have also stewarded for many years and I have worked in the card room and on trophy tables of many affiliate shows throughout my time in the cat fancy.

I now live on the Mid North Coast of NSW, in the town of Kempsey, since moving from Sydney in 1995.

NSW C.F.A. Inc. Members & Associate Members Cat/Kitten of the Year Awards

A cat/kitten may accumulate points for a Members or Associate Members Cat/Kitten of the Year Award only whilst it is in the ownership* of a financial member of The NSW Cat Fanciers' Association Inc. Note that:

- (i) should an owner become a member of the Association after the commencement of the calendar year, ie after 1st January, a cat/kitten owned by the new member will be eligible for the awards but points will accumulate only from the date that the membership application is processed by the Association's office.
- (ii) if during the year ownership of a cat/kitten is transferred from a financial member to a new owner who is not a member, the cat/kitten's ownership by a financial member will be deemed to be continuous provided a membership application from the new owner is received by the Association's office within 4 weeks of the transfer as recorded by the NSW C.F.A.

* joint owners must each be financial members of the Association



TO GET TO THE SHOW

Greta is in the Wine Country area of the Lower Hunter Valley, some 50km or so west of Newcastle. From Sydney it would be best to travel to Greta via the Pacific Motorway (M1), the Hunter Expressway (M15), and a short section of the New England Highway (A43).

The Hunter Expressway is a 39.5km dual carriage motorway commencing at the Newcastle Interchange on the Pacific Motorway and joining the New England Highway just beyond Branxton.

■ Starting from Wahrenonga at the start of the Pacific Motorway (M1) you travel north

- take the off-ramp to **Newcastle/Singleton** at the Newcastle Interchange,
- just down this ramp take the left exit signposted to **Kurri Kurri/Singleton** and proceed on to join the Hunter Expressway.
- From the Hunter Expressway

EITHER at (A) exit left at the Interchange - signposted **Lovedale/Lockinvar** - follow right, crossing over the Expressway and take the exit signposted to **Lockinvar/Greta**. Follow along Allandale Road to

the intersection with the New England Highway. There turn left and drive along the New England Highway to Greta

OR at (B) exit left at the Branxton Interchange - signposted **Branxton/Cessnock** - and follow around the roundabout, taking the exit signposted to **Greta**. Follow along the Wine Country Drive to join the New England Highway and to Greta.

Travelling at the standard motorway speed the trip from the start of the M1 at Wahrenonga to Greta takes about 2 hours.

Other routes from the Sydney area are possible.

■ From the Upper Hunter Valley use the New England Highway to travel to Greta.

■ From Newcastle area take the Newcastle link road to join the Hunter Expressway.

■ From the North Coast travel towards Newcastle and navigate to join to the Hunter Expressway at an appropriate point.

In general, probably it would be best to use your car's GPS System, or you smart phone GPS app, to set your trip to the show.
