# **EXHIBITOR INFORMATION AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

## **MEMBERSHIP STATUS:**

All exhibitor's resident in NSW must be current financial members of NSWCFCA, except when the show is an Open Entry show where Cats NSW and ANCATS members may exhibit. New exhibitors' resident in NSW may show three times as non-members provided their exhibits are registered in their name with NSWCFCA. An exhibitor resident in another state must be a member of a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF and the exhibits must be registered in the exhibitor's name with that controlling body.

## **ENTRIES:**

All entries must be submitted on the current official NSWCFCA Entry Form (available from the NSWCFCA website) together with a clear copy of each exhibit's registration certificate in the name of the exhibitor as owner. For interstate exhibitors where the registration certificate does not include a four-generation pedigree, then a four-generation pedigree must be provided showing the breeds and colours of all forebears. **All exhibits must conform to CCCA Breed Standards.**

## **COMPLAINTS & DISPUTES:**

Show Procedure 1.3 requires that any dispute arising from any aspect of the conduct of a show shall be referred to the Show Committee of the show prior to the conclusion of the show.

## **RETURNED CHEQUES:**

Should any cheque be returned unpaid, a bank cheque, money order, or EFT transfer will be required to ensure that the entry is processed, and the costs incurred by the club for the returned cheque shall be paid by the exhibitor.

## **AMENDMENTS TO SEX/COLOUR/TITLES:**

Any change to the sex or colour/pattern or the title of an exhibit after an entry has been lodged must be submitted in writing to the Show Secretary together with a copy of the amended Certificate of Registration no later than one week prior to the show date unless arrangements have been made with the Show Secretary to provide the changes at a later date. No changes will be made to the catalogue or judging slips on the show day.

## **CLAWS TO BE CLIPPED:**

The front and back claws of each exhibit must be clipped. Judges may class an exhibit as Not in Show Condition (NSC) when the claws are not adequately clipped.

## **VETERINARY INSPECTION:**

Each exhibit must be inspected by and pass the Veterinary's Officer's inspection before being allowed to be benched in the show. Exhibitors are to handle their own cats at the vetting table.

## **VACCINATION OF KITTENS:**

All kittens must be vaccinated and at least one vaccination must be administered by a qualified veterinary practitioner. Exhibitors must produce documentary evidence (valid vaccination certificate signed by a qualified vet) for each kitten, and a vaccination shall have been carried out not less than 14 days prior to the date of the show. Failure to produce a valid vaccination certificate at vetting may result in a single vet out for the kitten concerned. (See also Show Procedure 6.3 c.)

## **AGGRESSIVE EXHIBITS:**

A Judge or Steward is not required to handle any exhibit showing signs of aggression. Owners have a duty of care not to bench any exhibit that has a reported history of fractious behaviour. The Show Manager in consultation with the Show Representative may request the removal of any such exhibit from the show.

## **NSWCFA CAT/KITTEN OF THE YEAR AWARDS:**

To be eligible for Cat of the Year award a cat must be in the continuous ownership of a NSWCFCA financial member throughout the year. Points are awarded based on the Top Five results at a show – 1<sup>st</sup> -10pts; 2<sup>nd</sup> – 7pts; 3<sup>rd</sup> - 4pts; 4<sup>th</sup> – 2pts; 5<sup>th</sup> – 1pt.

Note 1. Where an owner becomes a member after the start of a calendar year, points will only accumulate from the date the membership application is processed by the NSW CFA Office.

Note 2. If during the year a cat is transferred to a new owner who is not a member, the cat's ownership by a financial member will be deemed continuous provided a membership application from the new owner is received and recorded by the NSW CFA Office within 4 weeks of the date of transfer, otherwise note 1 shall apply.

Note 3. Where an interstate, Cats NSW, or ANCATS exhibit gains a Top Five placing, then that placing remains awarded to that exhibit and the placing of NSW CFA exhibits is not altered.

# OUR JUDGES' PROFILES

## Judy Lewis (QFA)

Quite a lot of people know me as a happy, always open and warm-hearted person. I am very easy going and like a laugh. Over 20 years ago (add a few more on!) I started showing a colourpoint Persian. I had so much fun that I decided to start breeding those "fluffy" little darlings. After 18 months of waiting for a very extreme typed Persian female, she finally arrived from Sophie Hope-Johnston (Solaris Cattery Adelaide). I was so proud to show this beautiful black girl, her name was "Solaris Sweet Baroness". Later on, I received a black smoke Persian male kitten from "Mynamz Cattery" and that's where it all began. I loved and still love breeding me smokes, of any colour. Over the years I introduced the tabby pattern. Now of course, I do breed one of the very attractive patterns, a stunner of a pattern.....the silver tabby. I was always very impressed with the orange eyed whites, yes, I do agree with you, it is very hard, but, when you do have a beautiful O.E. White and present it in the proper way, it's just breath taking. In 2003/04 I started my Group 1 Judges course and completed and passed this successfully. Thank you very much to all concerned. My first Group 1 Judging assignment was on September 12th 2004, I couldn't ask for a better start to Judge, I truly was in "Heaven", a day I will never forget....Since I started judging, I have come a long way, it was a very big honour to be invited from Dennis Turner and Pat Andrews to NSW and judge at the Ku-Ring-Gai Cat Show! The Himalayan Cat Club show. Two years in a row 2007/08. Lorraine Vahland, "discovered me @ this show" and Lorraine invited me to judge in Canberra, I have to admit, we had lots of fun and enjoyment. Since I have my Judges licence, I came around and I have met through my judging, absolutely wonderful people, we had lots of fun and laughs, just a great time.... just the way it should be at a cat show. My first overseas assignment was in New Zealand, in August 2009, after that, I'm now every year once or twice, somewhere in New Zealand judging those wonderful Cats and Kittens – Thank you very much. The meaning of breeding and showing and now Judging is "Enjoyment, Fun and lots of Laughs", use those words as your Keywords, like I do and you will see you will have always a very enjoyable day at the cat show. I hope that will never stop.

## Jenny Weekes (CatsNSW)

I have owned cats my entire life, starting with farm cats as a child. I purchased my first pet Birman in 1990 and my first breeding Birman in 1994 . With my husband Greg we have bred Birmans in Canberra, Townsville, Wellington (NZ) on the Gold Coast and now at Murrumbateman. My first prefix – Kachin was granted in Canberra in 1994 and my current prefix – Sunsoar was granted in 1997. We have achieved many major awards at specialist and All Breed shows including Birman Cat Fanciers Qld. Best Female Kitten 2008 and 2010 and Supreme Exhibit 2010 and 2012. On the Gold Coast in 2006 I was able to commence training to become a judge and gained my Companion Cat licence in 2007 with QFA, followed by a Group 1 (Longhair) licence in 2009. I became an All Breeds Judge in 2014. While living in New Zealand I developed the quarterly magazine, Flash Cats which I continued to edit for several years after returning to Australia. Prior to moving to Murrumbateman, I held various positions including the Secretary of QFA Inc., Secretary of the Birman Cat Fanciers of Qld Club and President of the Gold Coast Cat Club. Greg and I are enjoying our life in Murrumbateman and share our home with our Birmans and our new pets, two Alpacas Cherokee and Warlock. Aside from my cat related activities I enjoy patchwork quilting, web site development, travelling and spending time with the grandchildren.

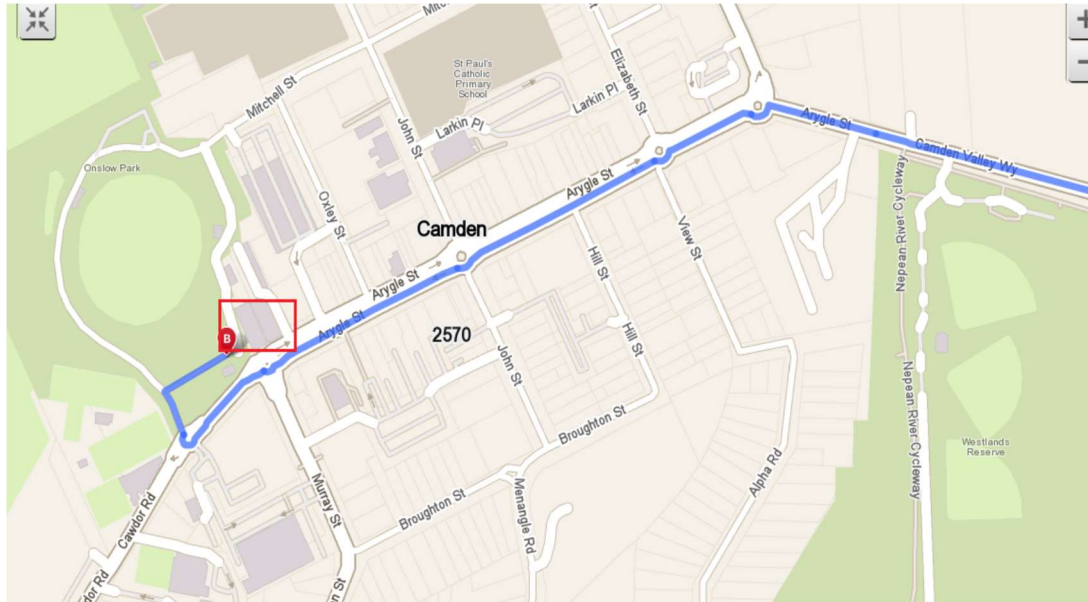
## Marg Sim (NSW CFA)

I have always had cats, firstly moggies then my father bred Seal Point Siamese. I met a pair of Burmese in the early 1970's and fell in total love with them, especially the Blue Burmese. When I settled down in Sydney I went in search of a Blue Burmese and ended up with a Lilac and Chocolate – they converted my partner Don to cats and in particular Burmese. He in turn converted me to Labrador Retrievers. We moved out of the city to Moss Vale – we had space and time so I commenced breeding and showing in 1987 under the prefix Bima. I breed all colours of Burmese and love them all – my favourites are blue, red and blue tortie. This led to stewarding which gave me a love of many other breeds and in 1994 I commenced a judging course. I completed Group 2 in 1996, Group 3 in 1998 and in 2009 completed Group 1. I have judged in most states of Australia as well as in New Zealand. I have been involved in clubs – club secretary, committee member and am currently President of the Burmese Cat Society of Australasia. I have experience as show manager as well as working in card rooms and trophies, also lots of experience setting up and pulling down shows. In my other life I am a registered nurse and midwife and currently work in a neonatal nursery. I have experience in management, aged care, education, women's health, aboriginal health, community health and paediatrics. My other interests are gardening, patchwork and quilting.

## Christine Tomlinson (NSW CFA)

I have always had a love affair with cats for as long as I can remember and would always befriend any cat I came across. I got my first pedigree cat in 1977 and started to show in 1978. He was a red point Siamese and this was the beginning of my involvement in the cat world. Together with my husband Ray, an All Breeds Judge, we breed and show both Siamese and British shorthair under the Tomadah Prefix. We specialise in red, cream and tortie point Siamese which have taken out many Best In Show and Group 2 Cat of the Year Awards. We live in Griffith in the heart of the Murrumbidgee Irrigation Area and in 1982, with the help of others, were instrumental in the founding of the MIA Cat Club. For various periods over the years since then I have held the positions of President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Publicity Officer of the Club. I am an experienced Steward and completed the Companion Cat Judges Training Course in 1997 and since then have judged at many shows. I successfully completed the Group 2 Judges Training Course in 2001, obtaining my full Group 2 Licence on 1 July 2003.

# DIRECTIONS TO VENUE



## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THIS SHOW – Covid19

1. This show is being run under a COVID safe plan. This plan forms part of the schedule. The COVID safe plan significantly changes the way in which the show will be conducted.
2. By entering this show, you are agreeing that you have read the COVID safe plan and that you will comply with the requirements described in it.
3. Any exhibitor who at any time does not comply with the requirements in the COVID safe plan or fails to comply with a direction of a show official in relation to the plan during the show, will be asked to leave the show hall with their exhibit(s) immediately with all prizes and awards forfeited.
4. There is a limit on the number of people allowed in the show hall in line with government requirements on the date of the show. In your entry, you are asked to indicate how many people will be attending the show with you. You are asked to advise the show manager if this changes prior to the show date.
5. The show committee reserves the right to change any requirements or processes relating to the show at any time and without prior consultation with exhibitors. Exhibitors will be advised if any requirements change.
6. Should the show be cancelled for any reason, entry fees will be refunded in full.
7. There will be no catering supplied by the Birman Cat Club of Australia.

Thank you for considering placing an entry in our show. Before you enter any exhibits, we would like you to consider the following information put together in order to make the show pleasant for everyone.

This will be an open show, with exhibitors allowed in the show hall throughout the day and able to watch their exhibits being judged. There will be chairs available although exhibitors are also encouraged to bring their own portable chairs if they prefer. Exhibitors are asked not to use other people's chairs once they have seated themselves.

The general public will be allowed to enter the hall under current COVID public health orders in relation to numbers and spacing. Please be civil in your interactions with each other and with members of the public as we all get used to running cat shows under these requirements.

Please follow the guidelines in the show hall to comply with requirements relating to physical distancing.

PLEASE:

Display patience at all times during the show to EVERYONE in the hall

- Follow the directions of the show officials at all times
- Sign in using the QR code displayed at the entry to the hall. Please also sign out using the code when you leave at the end of the show as this is very important for contact tracing purposes.
- Remain seated unless you are using the amenities or attending to your cat (under the direction of the bay manager)
- Observe physical distancing where possible and only sit in the seat you have claimed at the beginning of the show
- Sanitise/wash your hands regularly.

You may find that the new requirements are frustrating and that show participation is not the same as before. It will take longer to set up at the start of the show and to leave at the end of the date. Time spent grooming your cat for presentation will be limited to a small window to allow everyone to present their cats in the same manner. Please remember to display patience and be courteous.

If you feel you cannot work with the new requirements, or you are anxious about being in a show environment, consider whether you should enter the show.

We need your patience and co-operation. There may be issues, please provide suggestions if things are not going smoothly but please be polite when making your suggestions.

The show manager reserves the right to ask any exhibitor at any time to leave the show hall with their exhibits if they are not complying with the new requirements. In this event, the exhibitor's exhibit(s) will be disqualified.

### **General**

1. Physical distancing guidelines apply – attendees must aim to maintain 1.5 metres distance from other people. Physical distancing does not apply to members of the same household or those who have travelled to the event together.
2. The 2 square metre per person rule applies to the show hall under current (March 2021) public health orders. This sets the limit at the number of people allowed into the hall at any one time at 200.
3. Members of the public will be permitted into the show hall and based on the 2 square metre rule. They will be expected to observe physical distancing rules.
4. Before entering the venue, attendees will be asked to sanitise their hands. Hand sanitisers will be set up throughout the hall. People are also encouraged to bring their own sanitiser to use throughout the day.
5. NSW Health recommends that people wear a face mask if they cannot reliably stay 1.5 metres for others, unless they are under the age of 12. Wearing a mask is not mandatory but is recommended.
6. Each section will be assigned a steward or bay manager. They will be available to ensure that benching, judging, cat welfare and exhibit departure are managed in accordance with show rules and distancing requirements. You must follow their direction at all times.

### **Entries**

7. Exhibitors are not limited in the number of pre-arranged people they may bring with them.
8. All exhibitors must provide their name and contact details on entry to the hall, preferably via the hall's Service NSW QR code. Attendees must declare on entry to the hall that they have not had any flu-like symptoms on the past two weeks, that they have not been in a designated COVID hot spot in the past two weeks, that they do not feel unwell and that they have not been in close contact with anyone diagnosed with COVID-19 within the past two weeks. This may be subject to amendment depending on orders in place on the date of the show.



### **Benching and set up**

9. Exhibitors are encouraged to bring their own cages. There will be limited numbers of single and double cages available for hire.
10. Benching for exhibitors will be staggered (as required) to comply with physical distancing rules. Exhibitors will be asked to bench their cats as quickly as possible to allow other exhibitors to bench their cats with satisfactory time. As a guide, exhibitors should spend no more than 10 minutes per exhibit setting up and benching.
11. In order to prevent a large line, vetting will be conducted in cage. Please place your exhibit's vaccination record (if appropriate). The vet will initial the exhibit's cage number when it has been vetted.
12. Exhibitors will need to maintain 1.5 metres from other people at all times. As a rough guide, there should be at least one double cage width between exhibitors at all times. The bay manager will manage this process to ensure all exhibitors are fairly able to access their cats.

### **Judging**

13. Judges are required to handle their own cats.
14. Stewards will be responsible for sanitising the table between exhibits. Stewards will also sanitise cage doors in each section when the judge has completed the assignment in that section. The steward may also assist in the handling of a fractious or otherwise difficult cat, providing that they do not stand in close proximity to the judge for longer than 15 minutes.
15. At their discretion, the steward/bay manager may allow exhibitors to enter the bay to attend to a cat. This includes cleaning a soiled cat, to place or remove a water bowl in a cage, or to quickly refresh an exhibit between judging rings. If permitted into the bay, the exhibitor will be expected to attend to their cat quickly.
16. Consistent with current practice, judges may, at their discretion, call exhibitors into the bay to present their exhibits for top awards. The judge should call no more than three exhibitors into the bay at any given time and should ensure that they and the exhibitors remain 1.5 metres apart at all times.
17. Lunch breaks for judges and workers will be staggered.

### **End of show and departure**

18. Award cards and certificates will be placed on show cages as usual.
19. Awards, especially any prizes, should be placed in the exhibitor's car as soon as possible at the direction of the bay manager to streamline departure at the end of the day.
20. Departure and removal of cats from show hall will be staggered (as required). Exhibitors are asked to remain patient during this process.
21. Exhibitors may be permitted to depart the show hall at the completion of judging and prior to best in show presentations with the approval of the show manager. Cats must not be left unattended in cars.

- An Exhibit owned by a NSW resident must be registered with NSW CFA, and the exhibitor must be a member of NSW CFA unless the show has been declared an Open Entry Show.
- Each kitten will be entered automatically in the relevant age class
- Each cat will be entered automatically in the relevant open class
- Each eligible cat will be entered automatically in the relevant CCCA class (free class – Ancats exhibits are not eligible)
- To ENTER A LITTER in the Show: Write LITTER & include the number of kittens in the litter, followed by the litter registration number. A photocopy of the Litter Registration Certificate must be attached.
