#### 2 Siamese standard

Proposed Motion:

‘that the allowances made for incomplete markings for the ticked tabby pattern in the general description, and in the Oriental standard be extended to the Siamese standard:

Wording suggested:

1. To make a small alteration to the last sentence before the colours :

" Chocolate and dilute varieties may not gain full leg markings until up to eighteen months of age, tabby points based on the ticked tabby pattern may never gain them, no penalty'

AND

2. In to the previous paragraph add at the end another sentence reading

" In tabby points based on the ticked tabby pattern, tail rings may be restricted to the outer part of the tail, ending in a solid coloured tip. No Penalty."

- We were under the distinct impression that genetic terminology was to be used "across the board" and have complied with this requirement and adjusted our database accordingly.
- For example:
- The term Himalayan/Colorpoint was no longer to be used - to be referred to as Pointed Persian.
- The term Harlequin was no longer to be used - to be referred to as Van.
- The term Chinchilla was no longer to be used - to be referred to as Black Tipped.
- The term Shaded Silver was no longer to be used - to be referred to as Black Shaded.

- A protocol for 'breed standard review and revision'
- A protocol for 'breed standard review and revision' Second Draft submitted to CCCA Meeting for review by the delegate bodies.**
- This protocol is to set out a series of steps which ensures that any proposed changes/additions to Breed Standards, allowable outcrosses, recognised colours/patterns are sent back to each affiliate for them to collect and collate the opinions of their experienced breeders PLUS, for anything other than minor changes, a presentation and discussion at the Annual Judges Conference, allowing the inclusion of breeder/s presentation/s as well as by experienced Judges of the breed in question
1. Submission by a breeder/s to their governing body concerning changes, amendments to their breed Standard, with the request that the matter be considered at the CCCA level.  
THIS IS THE CURRENT PROTOCOL AND COVERS ALL SUBMISSIONS TO BE PRESENTED TO CCCA.

Reaffirmed policy and all members gave an assurance that this will be enforced.

Breed chart to be followed.

Original registration numbers must be preserved.

2. Submission received by CCCA Secretary, - proposal **immediately** circulated to Secretaries of all Affiliated Bodies (including the body initially submitting the proposal) with the request that they circulate to/advise their breeders of the nature of the submission, and invite their input.  
ACTED ON IMMEDIATELY, WITHOUT GOING TO A CCCA MEETING

*The real area of debate needs to be thrown back to the breeders, how this is to be implemented would be up to each affiliate, where there are breed clubs they would be consulted, publications could be used (eg Feline Focus, Catching Up) but these don't cover anything like the whole breedership - I do see the possibility that various web chat lists could be utilised to inform breeders that a debate was going on, or there could be a mail out (which may be unnecessarily expensive unless there are major revisions proposed). GIVE A SHORT TIME FRAME (fitting in with the timing of the CCCA meetings) FOR RESPONSES (PREFERABLY NO MORE THAN 6 WEEKS) If it really matters there will be a response!!*

3. Secretaries of Affiliated organisations to write to Judges/breeders and invite contributions on the proposed changes, via their own internal protocols. Secretaries of Affiliated bodies to collate and forward these responses to the CCCA Secretary who will provide them to the Breeds Council to prepare a recommendation to the CCCA.

Our role to sort out submissions, assess whether it is a major or minor matter, whether it is very divisive of Cat Fancy, whether it breaks any existing rules regarding breed standards, whether there are any over riding health or genetic considerations, and whether it warrants consideration/presentations to the annual judges conference.
